
Nina E. Bitton

From their early years as teenagers they would find some way to scrape the money up to go dancing! They continued to dance at the Elks lodge in Pocatello in their later years as well.

Nina was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. In her later years she was active and read the scriptures and many other books.

Nina is survived by her son Dennis (Linda) Bitton of Idaho Falls, Idaho and daughter Sue (Kevin) Hansen of Meridian, Idaho.
